ARLINGTON is DSV's latest addition to its high-quality milling wheat portfolio. It has demonstrated excellent performance in Recommended List trials and has received positive feedback from both millers and bakers.

ARLINGTON is a variety that perfectly balances strong yield, top-tier baking performance and excellent agronomic traits. With a UK treated yield of 99% of controls, ARLINGTON is just 1% behind the current Group 1 leader, and is the highest-yielding Group 1 variety in the East region.

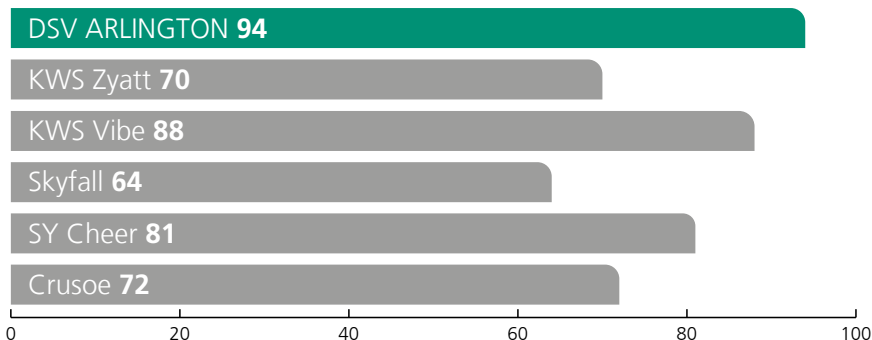

GROUP 1 UNTREATED YIELD UK PERFORMANCE COMPARISON



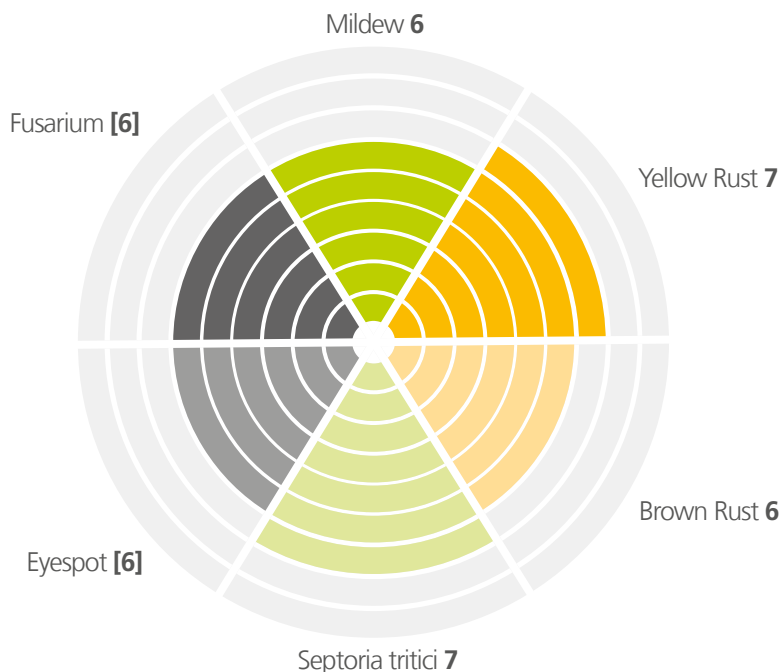
ARLINGTON offers a higher yield than KWS Vibe, SY Cheer, Skyfall and Crusoe. It is the highest yielding variety in the second cereals spot and the second highest in the first cereal situation.

AGRONOMIC FEATURES



In trials, ARLINGTON has exhibited a very clean appearance and combines a **rare mix of Pch1 eyespot resistance and Sm1 resistance to orange blossom midge** (only two varieties in the group have these characteristics), making it a top selection for growers.

ARLINGTON has the **highest septoria** of the Group 1 varieties and a high score for yellow rust with a 7. It has a good score for Mildew. Overall, DSV feels ARLINGTON offers the best disease package for farmers looking to grow a Group 1, coupled with the highest untreated yield in the group.

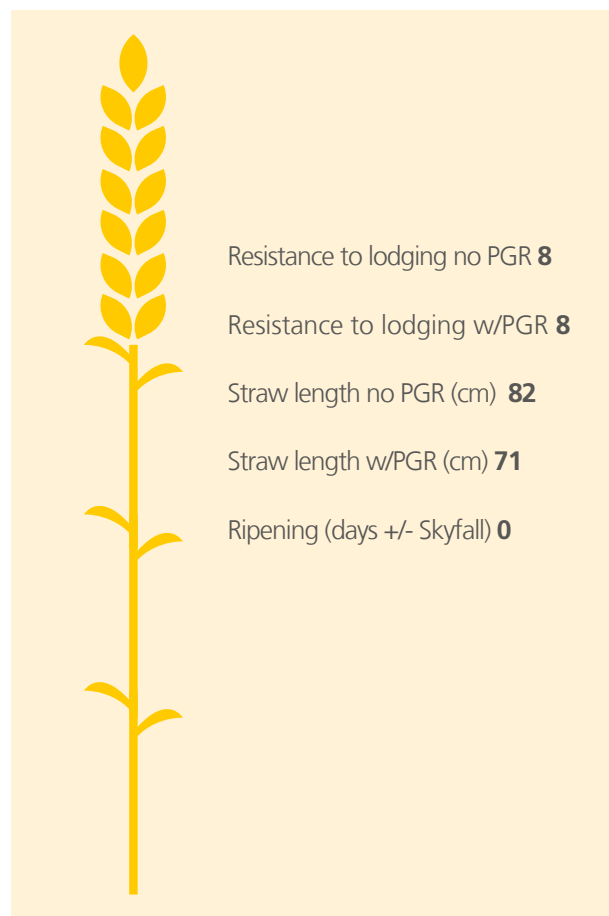
ARLINGTON has seen **little to no lodging** in trials since it has been introduced.

ROTATIONAL POSITION

ARLINGTON offers a very wide sowing window to growers with its short, stiff stem offering early drilling potential as well as having a low vernalisation requirement, which allows the variety to be drilled into late February / early March. The data that DSV has been collected so far indicates that ARLINGTON can outperform spring wheats when drilled later in the sowing season.

The low vernalization requirement means that ARLINGTON can be sown late into the season, providing flexibility for farmers who are unable to sow in the autumn or who need to switch to spring sowing to suit the conditions

ARLINGTON can also be grown across a wide range of soil types, ensuring consistency wherever it is grown. It is the highest-yielding Group 1 on heavy soils.

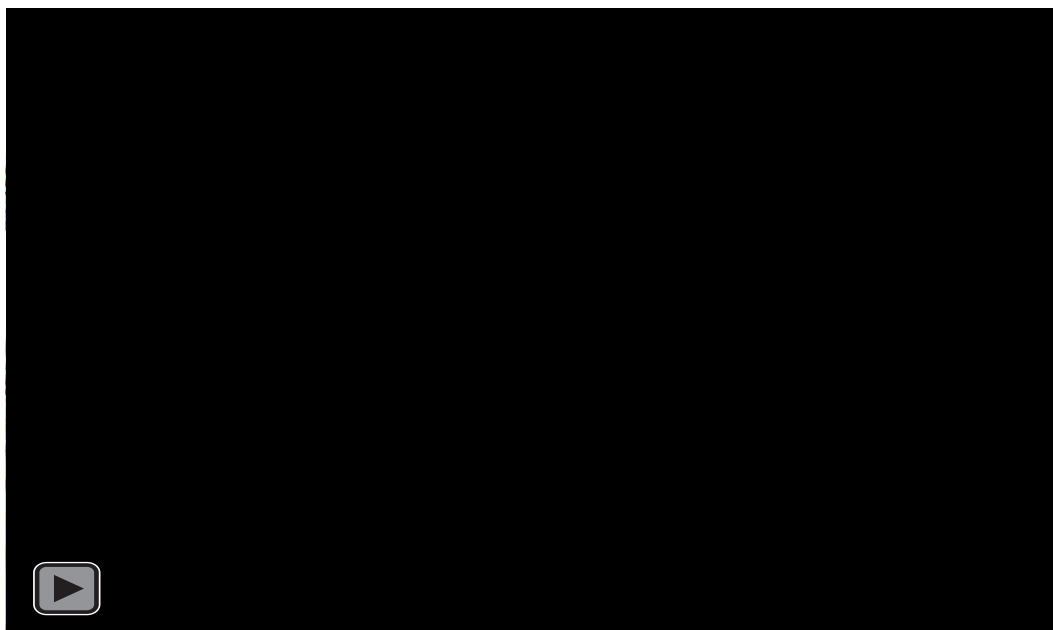
